Can stakeholders understand the model? Can it be used for further analysis, prototyping, or communication? This relates directly to the [model validation techniques](#) employed during and after the workshop.

3. Evaluating Collaborative Dynamics and Communication

Modeling workshops are inherently collaborative. A project test examines how effectively participants interacted, shared ideas, and communicated. Were there any bottlenecks in communication? Did all voices feel heard? Did the collaborative environment foster creativity and problem-solving, or did it lead to discord? 4. Measuring Problem-Solving and Innovation Outcomes
