Key Advantages of Dedicated Servers: Full control over settings, unlimited customization with plugins and mods, ability to host a large number of players, ideal for communities and large projects.

6. **Click "Done."** The server will now appear in your server list. Double-click it to join.

Troubleshooting Connection Issues: If you can't connect, double-check the server address, ensure you're using the correct version of Minecraft, and confirm that the server is online and accessible. For dedicated servers, ensure the IP address is correct and that any firewalls or antivirus software aren't blocking the connection.

Java Edition vs. Bedrock Edition Multiplayer
