$(5M) + 7 (20M) + 28 (20M) + 41 (100M) + 205 (100M) + 180$ This final result is not directly M and D. The trick as commonly presented has a flaw and is more of a "guess" or a simplified version. A more accurate version that always works to reveal month and day would be:

1. Think of your birth month number.
2. Multiply by 2.
3. Add 5.
4. Multiply by 50.
5. Add your birth day number.
6. Add 365 (for a non-leap year).
7. Subtract 615.
8. The first two digits will be your birth month, the last two your birth day.

Revised Magic Revealed: Let M be the month and D be the day.

$M \times 2 = 2M$

$(2M) + 5 = 2M + 5$

$(2M + 5) \times 50 = 100M + 250$

$(100M + 250) + D = 100M + D + 250$

$(100M + D + 250) + 365 = 100M + D + 615$

$$(100M + D + 615) - 615 = 100M + D$$

This resultant number, $100M + D$, beautifully encodes the month and day. For example, if born on March 15th ($M=3, D=15$), the result is $100 \times 3 + 15 = 315$. The first two digits (3) are the month, and the last two (15) are the day. This is a fantastic example of how numbers can represent information and is a great way to teach **place value magic**.

The "Guess the Number of Fingers" Trick

This is a visual and interactive trick.

1. Ask a participant to hold up any number of fingers (1-10) on one hand, keeping it hidden.
2. Ask them to multiply the number of fingers by 3.

$3f$ (will be odd)

$3f + 1$ (will be even)

$(3f + 1) / 2 = 1.5f + 0.5$

$(1.5f + 0.5) - f = 0.5f + 0.5$

This is not always 1. There's a slight variation required in the instructions for consistent results. A common and reliable version:

1. Hold up any number of fingers (1-5) on one hand.
2. Multiply by 9.
3. If the result is a 2-digit number, add the two digits together.
4. Subtract 5.

The answer will always be 4.

Revised Magic Revealed: Let the number of fingers be 'f' (1-5).

$9f$. The results will be 9, 18, 27, 36, 45.

Adding the digits: $9 \rightarrow 9$; $18 \rightarrow 1+8=9$; $27 \rightarrow 2+7=9$; $36 \rightarrow 3+6=9$; $45 \rightarrow 4+5=9$. So the sum of digits is always 9.
 $9 - 5 = 4$.
