Los Principios de Lean

Los Estándares de Six Sigma

Six Sigma se enfoca en reducir la variación en los procesos para mejorar la calidad y la consistencia. Para alcanzar este nivel, se utilizan herramientas estadísticas como: • *Diagramas de Pareto*: Identificar las causas más importantes de los problemas. • **Diagramas de dispersión**: Mostrar la relación entre dos variables. • **Análisis de capacidad de proceso**: Evaluar la capacidad del proceso para cumplir con las especificaciones. • **Diagramas de**

control: Monitorear el proceso para identificar desviaciones.

Aplicación de Lean Six Sigma en el Mundo Real

Al enfocarse en eliminar estos desperdicios, Lean busca crear flujos de trabajo más rápidos, eficientes y flexibles. La **mejora continua** es un mantra clave en la filosofía Lean.

Six Sigma: La Persecución de la Perfección (o casi)

Six Sigma, por otro lado, nació en Motorola a mediados de la década de 1980. Su objetivo principal es reducir la variabilidad en los procesos y
