Australia (2 bonus troops, 1 border) and South America (2 bonus troops, 2 borders) are generally considered easier to defend early on. Africa (3 bonus troops, 3 borders) and North America (5 bonus troops, 3 borders) offer more troops but are more challenging to secure. Asia (7 bonus troops, 5 borders) and Europe (5 bonus troops, 4 borders) are the most lucrative but also the most difficult to hold.

Strategies for Acquiring and Holding Continents

1. **The Swift Strike:** If a continent is lightly defended by an opponent and you have the forces, a rapid, aggressive push can be effective.
