Room Temperature is Key

Don't Overmix

While you want to ensure ingredients are well combined, overmixing can lead to a greasy or tough buttercream, especially once the sugar is added. Mix until just combined and then follow the recipe's recommended beating time for aeration.

Temperature Control is Crucial

Buttercream is sensitive to temperature. If your kitchen is too warm, your buttercream can become soupy. If it's too cold, it can become stiff and difficult to work with. If your buttercream is too soft, refrigerate it for 15-20 minutes and then re-whip. If it's too stiff, let it sit at room temperature for a few minutes and re-whip.

Achieving the Right Consistency

My Buttercream is Curdled/Separated:

come together. If it remains stubborn, try gently warming the bowl over a bain-marie for a minute or two while beating, then immediately return to high speed. For American buttercream, this usually means the butter was too cold or not evenly incorporated.

A pinch of salt can help balance excessive sweetness. For meringue-based buttercreams, the sugar syrup is a significant contributor. For American buttercream, you can try adding a little more unsalted butter or a touch of lemon juice for tang.
