5. **Confirm Erase:** Terminal will warn you that the drive will be erased. Type 'Y' and press Enter to confirm.
6. **Wait for Completion:** The process can take a while. Terminal will show progress. Once complete, your USB drive will be named after the macOS installer (e.g., "Install macOS Sonoma").

Booting from the USB Installer:

1. **Shut down your Mac.**
2. **Connect the bootable USB drive.**
3. **Start your Mac in Recovery Mode:**
 1. **Apple Silicon:** Press and hold the power button until startup options appear, then select your USB drive.
 2. **Intel-based Macs:** Turn on your Mac and immediately press and hold the Option key until you see the Startup Manager. Select your USB drive.
4. **Select the USB drive as the startup disk.**
5. **Follow the on-screen instructions** to install macOS. You will have the option to erase the disk using Disk Utility before installation.

Method 3: Erasing and Reinstalling Using Disk Utility and Recovery

2. Restoring Your Data with Migration Assistant

If you chose to restore from a backup during setup, Migration Assistant will do most of the heavy lifting. If you skipped it or want to do it later:

1. Open Migration Assistant from Applications > Utilities.
2. Follow the on-screen instructions to transfer your information from your Time Machine backup or another Mac. This process can also take a considerable amount of time depending on the amount of data.

3. Reinstalling Applications

After your data is restored, you'll need to reinstall your applications:

1. **App Store:** Open the App Store and go to your Purchases tab to re-download apps bought there.
2. **Downloaded Installers:** Run any installers you saved.
3. **Developer Websites:** Visit the websites of software developers for applications that were downloaded directly or require new installers.

4. Updating macOS and Applications

5. **Activation Lock Issues (iCloud):** If you're reinstalling on a Mac that was previously linked to an Apple ID, you might encounter Activation Lock. You'll need the Apple ID and password that was used to set up the Mac.
