2. **Weaknesses:** Can be restrictive and difficult to maintain long-term, may lead to nutrient deficiencies if not well-planned, and can cause side effects like the "keto flu." Requires careful attention to electrolyte balance and fiber intake.

The emphasis on fat-burning can be appealing, but sustainability is often a concern.

Low-Fat Diets

These programs emphasize reducing fat intake, particularly saturated and trans fats, while often increasing carbohydrate consumption.
