The classic fix is a force restart. For iPads with a Home button, press and hold the Home button and the top button (or side button) simultaneously until the Apple logo appears. For iPads without a Home button, quickly press and release

the Volume Up button, then quickly press and release the Volume Down button, then press and hold the top button until the Apple logo appears.

App Crashing or Not Loading

Try closing and reopening the app. If that doesn't work, uninstall and reinstall the app from the App Store. Ensure your iPadOS is updated to the latest version, as updates often include bug fixes.

Wi-Fi or Bluetooth Connectivity Problems

Try turning Wi-Fi or Bluetooth off and then back on. Restart your iPad and your router. If the issue persists, go to Settings > General > Transfer or Reset iPad > Reset > Reset Network Settings. This will erase all saved Wi-Fi passwords and Bluetooth pairings, so you'll need to reconnect.

Battery Draining Quickly

Check your battery usage in Settings > Battery to identify which apps are consuming the most power. Reduce screen brightness, disable background app refresh for non-essential apps (Settings > General > Background App Refresh), and consider enabling Low Power Mode when battery levels are low.
