4. **Solve linear equations and inequalities:** This includes equations and inequalities involving rational numbers, and those that may require using the distributive property or combining like terms.

The skills developed in this domain are fundamental for all subsequent work in algebra. The Common Core emphasizes not just solving equations but also understanding the underlying principles that make the solutions valid.

Geometry

Seventh grade geometry focuses on developing spatial reasoning and understanding the properties of two- and three-dimensional shapes. Students will build upon their knowledge of shapes and their attributes to explore concepts like area, volume, and angle relationships.

1. **Draw, construct, and describe geometrical figures:** Students learn to draw and construct specific geometrical figures given certain conditions (e.g., drawing a triangle given side lengths, or constructing an angle bisector). They also describe these figures using precise geometric language.
2. **Understand the relationship between two-dimensional and three-dimensional shapes:** This includes understanding cross-sections of three-dimensional figures and how they relate to two-dimensional shapes.
3. **Solve real-world and mathematical problems involving area, volume, and surface area:** Students will apply their knowledge of formulas to calculate the area of triangles, quadrilaterals, and other polygons, as well as the volume and surface area of prisms and pyramids.
4. **Understand congruence and similarity:** While not as deeply explored as in later grades, seventh graders begin to understand the concepts of congruence (figures that have the same size and shape) and similarity (figures that have the same shape but not necessarily the same size) through transformations like translations, rotations, and reflections.
5. **Angle relationships:** Students will explore the relationships between angles formed by intersecting lines, including vertical angles and angles formed by a transversal intersecting parallel lines.

The geometry standards in seventh grade aim to develop visual and spatial reasoning skills that are applicable to a wide range of fields, from architecture and engineering to art and design. The emphasis on problem-solving in real-world contexts makes these concepts more tangible.

Statistics and Probability

This domain introduces students to the basics of data analysis and probability. They will learn to collect, organize, analyze, and interpret data, and to understand basic probability concepts.

1. **Use random sampling to draw conclusions about a population:** Students learn the importance of random sampling in making valid inferences about a larger population. They will compare the characteristics of samples to draw conclusions.
2. **Draw informal comparative inferences about two populations:** Seventh graders learn to compare data from two different populations, looking for measures of center (mean, median) and measures of variability (range, interquartile range) to make informal inferences.

3. **Investigate chance processes and develop, use, and evaluate probability models:** Students are introduced to the concept of probability as a measure of the likelihood of an event occurring. They will learn to calculate simple probabilities and use probability models to predict the outcomes of chance events.
4. **Understand that the probability of a chance event is a number between 0 and 1:** They will also learn to represent probabilities as fractions, decimals, or percentages.

The ability to understand and interpret data is increasingly important in today's data-driven world. The statistics and probability standards equip students with foundational skills for making informed decisions and understanding quantitative information.

The Emphasis on Mathematical Practices

Beyond specific content knowledge, the Common Core State Standards for Mathematics place a strong emphasis on developing students' "mathematical practices." These are the essential skills and habits of mind that proficient mathematicians employ. For seventh graders, cultivating these practices is as important as mastering the content itself. The eight mathematical practices are:

1. **Make sense of problems and persevere in solving them:** Students should be able to understand the meaning of a problem and have strategies to solve it, even if it's challenging.
2. **Reason abstractly and quantitatively:** This involves students' ability to make sense of quantities and their relationships in problem situations, and to represent them symbolically.
3. **Construct viable arguments and critique the reasoning of others:** Students should be able to justify their thinking and listen to and evaluate the arguments of their peers.
4. **Model with mathematics:** This practice encourages students to use mathematical concepts and tools to solve real-world problems.
5. **Use appropriate tools strategically:** Students should be able to select and use tools, such as calculators, computers, or geometric tools, effectively.
6. **Attend to precision:** This involves using clear and precise mathematical language and notation, and being careful in calculations.
7. **Look for and make use of structure:** Students should be able to recognize patterns and structures in mathematical ideas and use this understanding to solve problems.
8. **Look for and express regularity in repeated reasoning:** This involves students noticing when calculations or processes are repeated and finding a general rule or formula.

These practices are woven throughout the curriculum, encouraging students to be active, engaged, and thoughtful learners. They promote a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts and foster the development of critical thinking skills.
