Example Answer: "I find motivation in the inherent purpose of the role – helping people. Even on repetitive days, I remind myself that each call represents an individual with a specific need, and my ability to resolve it effectively can significantly impact their day. Achieving positive customer feedback or successfully resolving a particularly challenging issue also provides a great sense of accomplishment and renewed motivation."

8. "How do you keep your product or service knowledge up-to-date?"

Demonstrate your proactivity and commitment to learning. Mention using company resources, attending training, asking questions, and staying informed about company news and updates. Keywords: 'continuous learning', 'service improvement'.

I'm also interested in exploring opportunities for specialization within customer support or potentially moving into a supervisory or team lead role if that aligns with the company's growth trajectory. My ultimate goal is to continue developing my skills and contributing to exceptional customer outcomes."

Beyond the Questions: Pro Tips for Call Centre Interviews

Research the Company Thoroughly
