For example, instead of translating passages that speak of "man" in a generic sense as "man," the NRSV might use "humankind," "people," or "one." Similarly, when referring to individuals in a general way, it might use "they" instead of "he." This decision was not made lightly but was a deliberate effort to reflect a more accurate understanding of the original languages and to avoid perpetuating gender bias that had crept into earlier English translations.

Another area of meticulous attention for the NRSV translators was the rendering of the divine name. Following scholarly consensus and the practice of most modern translations, the NRSV renders the Hebrew Tetragrammaton (YHWH) as "the LORD" (with all caps) rather than using the traditional, though historically debated, English rendition of "Jehovah." This decision respects the reverence with which the name was treated in ancient Judaism and reflects a broad consensus among contemporary biblical scholars.

Furthermore, the NRSV benefits from the latest advancements in **textual criticism**. The translators had access to a wider range of ancient manuscripts and a more sophisticated understanding of how textual variants developed over time. This allowed them to produce a text that, in their judgment, more accurately reflected the original autographs of the biblical books.
