3. **Physical Science (PS):** Covers advanced concepts in physics, such as mechanics, thermodynamics, electromagnetism, and quantum mechanics. Chemistry topics include chemical bonding, kinetics, thermodynamics, and organic chemistry. Students engage in complex problem-solving and experimental

design.

Engineering, Technology, and Applications of Science (ETS):** Students may take specialized engineering courses where they apply scientific and mathematical principles to design, build, and test complex systems. They learn about design processes, optimization, and the ethical considerations of engineering solutions.

High school students are expected to demonstrate a sophisticated understanding of scientific principles, the ability to conduct independent research, and to critically evaluate scientific information. They are encouraged to connect their learning to potential career paths and to consider their role as informed citizens in a scientifically and technologically driven world.

This requires a deliberate design process at each grade level to ensure a logical and progressive learning experience.

Assessment Challenges and Opportunities

Traditional assessments often struggle to capture the full

spectrum of NGSS. New assessment methods are needed to evaluate students' abilities in scientific and engineering practices, their understanding of crosscutting concepts, and their ability to apply disciplinary core ideas in novel contexts. Performance-based assessments, project-based learning evaluations, and formative assessments that provide ongoing feedback are crucial.
