Solving Example Logical Reasoning Questions (Illustrative Solutions)

Solution:

The argument claims the ban *caused* the 30% decrease in litter. Option B directly weakens this by offering an alternative cause. Option A shows correlation but not causation. Option D is a consequence of the ban but not direct evidence of its impact on litter. Option C, however, directly supports the causal link by stating that plastic bags were a *major source* of the litter that has now decreased. If plastic bags were a significant part of the problem, their removal logically would lead to a significant reduction in that specific type of litter. Therefore, C strengthens the argument by reinforcing the premise that the ban addressed the source of the problem.

Example 2: Analytical Reasoning - Logic Game Snippet

Scenario: Five friends—A, B, C, D, and E—are attending a concert. They will be seated in a row of five seats, numbered 1 through 5 from left to right.

Rules:

1. A is seated to the immediate left of B.

2. C is seated in seat 3.
3. D is not seated in seat 5.

Question: If E is seated in seat 1, which of the following must be true?

Solution Approach:

1. **Diagram:** Draw 5 seats: _ _ _ _ _ (1 2 3 4 5)

2. **Apply Rule 2:** C is in seat 3: _ _ C _ _

3. **Apply the condition for the question:** E is in seat 1: E _ C _ _

4. **Apply Rule 1:** A is immediately left of B. This means AB is a block.

Possible placements for AB:

1. If E is in 1, and C is in 3, seats 2, 4, 5 are left.
2. Can AB be in 2-3? No, C is in 3.
3. Can AB be in 4-5? Yes. So: E _ C A B

5. **Check Rule 3:** D is not in seat 5. If AB is in 4-5, then D must be in the remaining seat, which is seat 2. So: E D C A B. This satisfies all rules and the condition.

6. **Deduce implications:** In this valid arrangement (E D C A B), we can see that:

1. E is in seat 1.
2. D is in seat 2.
3. C is in seat 3.
4. A is in seat 4.
5. B is in seat 5.

Therefore, if E is in seat 1, it *must* be true that B is in seat 5, A is in seat 4, D is in seat 2, and C is in seat 3.

Example 3: Quantitative Reasoning - Data Sufficiency

Question: What is the average speed of car X?

Statement (1): Car X traveled 100 miles in 2 hours.

Statement (2): Car X traveled at a constant speed for the entire journey.

Solution:

To find the average speed, we need the formula: $\text{Average Speed} = \frac{\text{Total Distance}}{\text{Total Time}}$.

Analyze Statement (1): This statement provides the total distance (100 miles) and the total time (2 hours). We can directly calculate the average speed: $100 \text{ miles} / 2 \text{ hours} = 50 \text{ mph}$. Therefore, Statement (1) alone is sufficient.

Analyze Statement (2): This statement says the speed was constant. If the speed was constant, then the average speed is equal to that constant speed. However, it doesn't tell us what that speed is. We don't know the distance or time traveled. Therefore, Statement (2) alone is not sufficient.

Conclusion: Since Statement (1) alone is sufficient to answer the question, the answer is (A).
