## Cannot Make or Receive FaceTime Calls

1. **Check if FaceTime is enabled in Settings.**

3. **Check if you have any restrictions enabled that might be blocking FaceTime.** (Settings > Screen Time > Content & Privacy Restrictions > FaceTime)
4. **Sign out of your Apple ID in FaceTime settings and sign back in.**
