2. The "Happy Path" as the Core

Cockburn suggests starting with the primary success scenario, often referred to as the "happy path." This is the most common, straightforward way for the user to achieve their goal. By clearly defining this core flow first, you establish a solid foundation. Once the happy path is well-understood and documented, you can then layer on extensions and alternatives.

This iterative approach prevents the overwhelming complexity that can arise from trying to document every conceivable exception from the outset. It promotes a more manageable and progressive understanding of system behavior.

3. Embrace the "System Context"

A use case doesn't exist in a vacuum. Cockburn highlights the importance of defining the system's boundaries and its interaction with the external world, including users (actors), other systems, and physical devices. This context helps clarify what is within the system's responsibility and what is outside of it.

Understanding the system context also aids in identifying dependencies and potential integration challenges early in the development lifecycle.

4. Actors: The Human or System Interacting

Actors are the entities that interact with the system to achieve a goal. They can be human users (e.g., "Customer," "Administrator") or other systems (e.g., "Payment Gateway," "Inventory System"). It typically starts with the actor's first action and ends with the successful achievement of the goal.

2. System adds the item to the cart and displays the updated cart contents.
3. Customer proceeds to checkout.
4. System presents the order summary and shipping information.

7. Extensions (Alternative Flows)

These describe variations from the main success scenario, including error conditions and less common paths. Each extension should specify when it occurs (triggered by what step or condition) and what happens. Extensions can also have their own sub-flows and exceptions.

5. Define Scope Clearly

A set of use cases should collectively define the scope of the system. Each use case should address a distinct, valuable goal for an actor.
