Coding Proficiency and Language Choice

2. **Reliability:** How will you ensure the system is available and fault-tolerant?
3. **Performance:** How will you optimize for speed and efficiency?
4. **Data Storage:** Choosing appropriate databases (SQL vs. NoSQL) and caching strategies.
5. **APIs and Microservices:** Designing interfaces and considering architectural patterns.
