This includes using unit squares to measure area and applying the formula for the area of a rectangle (length $\times$ width).

Geometry

While geometry in 3rd grade is foundational, it lays the groundwork for more complex spatial reasoning later on. Students explore:

1. **Reasoning with Shapes and Their Attributes:**

Identifying and describing two-dimensional shapes (polygons, quadrilaterals, triangles, rectangles, squares) based on their properties (e.g., number of sides, vertices, parallel lines).

2. **Partitioning Rectangles into Equal Shares:**

Understanding that a rectangle can be partitioned into equal columns and rows to form congruent squares and that the area is the number of these squares.
