Sharing (with consent) and Building Community

With student permission, consider sharing interesting (and appropriate) facts about classmates during icebreaker activities to help students get to know each other better. This can foster a stronger sense of community and mutual understanding. For example, "Did you know Sarah loves to bake and her favorite cookie is chocolate chip?"

Beyond the Worksheet: Other 'Getting to Know You' Strategies

While worksheets are a valuable tool, they are most effective when complemented by other strategies. Consider incorporating:

1. **One-on-One Conferences:** Short, informal chats with each student can provide deeper insights than a written form alone.
