The Psalms continue to be a central element of the RCL, providing

lyrical expressions of praise, lament, confession, and thanksgiving. The 2015 revision adjusted the psalm assignments to create a more consistent flow and to ensure a good balance of different types of psalms.

The Gospels:

The primary focus on Matthew, Mark, and Luke in Years A, B, and C respectively remains. However, the 2015 revision carefully selected passages to provide a more comprehensive overview of Jesus' teachings and ministry throughout the three-year cycle.

The Epistles:

The New Testament Epistles offer crucial insights into the early church and the application of the Gospel. The 2015 revision aimed to provide a more systematic reading of certain epistles over the course of the years, allowing congregations to engage with Paul's letters and other apostolic writings in a more coherent manner.

Implementing the RCL 2015 in a United Methodist Context

For United Methodist pastors and congregations, embracing the RCL 2015 involves more than just reading the assigned texts. It requires a commitment to:

1. **Faithful Preaching:** Sermons should grapple with the appointed texts, seeking to understand their meaning in their original context and their relevance for contemporary life. This involves careful exegesis and thoughtful application.
2. **Congregational Engagement:** Encouraging congregants to read the scriptures in advance, participate in Bible studies that explore the lectionary texts, and engage in prayer based on the

appointed readings.

3. **Liturgical Integration:** Ensuring that the readings are not simply recited but are woven into the fabric of the worship service, supported by hymns, prayers, and other liturgical elements.
4. **Pastoral Care:** Using the lectionary readings as a springboard for pastoral conversations, offering comfort, challenge, and encouragement based on God's Word.

The Future of the Lectionary

The Revised Common Lectionary 2015 represents a significant milestone in the ongoing effort to provide a rich and balanced diet of scripture for Christian worship. As theological understanding evolves and the needs of the church change, there may be future revisions. However, the principles guiding the 2015 update – a commitment to biblical breadth, theological depth, ecumenical understanding, and the formation of believers – are likely to remain central.

For United Methodists, the [RCL 2015](#) is not merely a schedule of readings; it is a covenantal pathway through the divine narrative, a resource for spiritual renewal, and a testament to the enduring power of God's word to guide and transform lives. By faithfully engaging with these appointed scriptures, congregations can continue to grow in their faith, deepen their understanding of God's love, and live out their calling as disciples of Jesus Christ.
