8. Princess Ida; or, Castle Adamant (1884)

This opera is a departure from the usual G&S formula, focusing on a feminist university and its conflict with a neighboring prince. It satirizes the women's suffrage movement and gender roles, albeit from a Victorian perspective. While perhaps not as universally beloved as some others, *Princess Ida* offers sharp wit and a unique theme for the G&S canon.

9. Ruddigore; or, The Witch's Curse (1887)

A wonderfully melodramatic and gothic spoof, *Ruddigore* plays with the conventions of melodrama. A curse dictates that each Baronet of Ruddigore must commit a crime daily. The opera is filled with ghosts, ancestral portraits coming to life, and a delightfully convoluted plot. It's a testament to Gilbert's mastery of absurdity and Sullivan's ability to compose music that perfectly captures the mood.

10. The Gondoliers; or, The King and I (1889)

Set in Venice, *The Gondoliers* follows two cheerful gondoliers who

discover they are, by a twist of fate, joint kings of a distant land. The opera satirizes social class, monarchy, and the absurdity of political systems. Its lively music, charming choruses, and engaging plot have made it a firm favorite, exploring themes of identity and social mobility.

11. Utopia, Limited; or, The Flowers of Progress (1893)

This operetta is a more direct and perhaps more pointed satire of British imperialism and the "civilizing mission." It tells the story of a fictional South Pacific nation that adopts English customs and institutions, leading to comedic and ironic consequences. While less frequently performed than some of its predecessors, *Utopia, Limited* offers insightful social commentary.

12. The Grand Duke; or, The Statutory Duel (1896)

The last opera to premiere during Gilbert and Sullivan's lifetime, *The Grand Duke* is characterized by its complex plot involving a supposed suicide pact and a peculiar duel to the death. While it had a less successful initial run than many of their earlier works, it still contains moments of classic G&S wit and musical charm. It's a fascinating, albeit more intricate, entry in their oeuvre.

13. The Rose of Persia (1899) - Composed by Osmond Carr with lyrics by Gilbert

While not a full Gilbert and Sullivan collaboration, this opera is significant for its lyrics being written by W.S. Gilbert. Though Sullivan did not

compose the music, it represents Gilbert's continued lyrical prowess and engagement with the operetta form. It is often included in comprehensive discussions of Gilbert's theatrical output.
