While a lower center of gravity can improve handling, significantly altering the suspension geometry can sometimes impact the bike's stability. If you experience any unsettling handling characteristics, consult a suspension specialist.

Professional Installation

If you are not comfortable with mechanical work or lack the proper tools, it is highly recommended to have a qualified motorcycle technician perform the installation. They have the expertise and equipment to ensure the job is done correctly and safely.

Maintaining Your Lowered Street Glide

Once your Street Glide is lowered, regular maintenance is even more critical:

1. **Regular Inspections:** Periodically check all hardware for tightness, especially after riding on rough surfaces.
2. **Fender Clearance Checks:** Keep an eye on the clearance between your rear fender and tire, especially when carrying a passenger or luggage.
3. **Tire Wear:** Monitor tire wear patterns. Sometimes, altered suspension geometry can affect how tires wear.
