Use small blocks representing hay bales and craft sticks representing corn stalks. Children can create linear patterns on a mat, such as "hay bale, corn stalk, hay bale, corn stalk." Introduce more complex patterns like AABB or ABC.

3. Animal Sound and Movement Patterns

experiences are invaluable.

5. **Child-Led Exploration:** While structured activities are important, allow children time to explore the farm materials and concepts on their own terms.
6. **Positive Reinforcement:** Offer praise and encouragement, focusing on effort and engagement rather than just correct answers.
