The method for iPads aligns with iPhones based on the presence or absence of a Home button.

1. **iPads with Face ID:** Press and quickly release the **Top button** and the **Volume Up button**.
2. **iPads with a Home button:** Press and quickly release the **Top button** (or

Side button on older models) and the **Home button**.
