The legacy of the film is also intertwined with the subsequent success of the television series, **Shadowhunters**, which premiered on Freeform in 2016. **Shadowhunters** managed to build upon the foundation laid by the film, developing the characters and lore more extensively over its four-season run. While **City of Bones** may have stumbled, it undeniably paved the way for a more successful small-screen adaptation. Ultimately, **The Mortal Instruments: City of Bones** film stands as a cautionary tale and a testament to the challenges of YA adaptation. It showcased the potential of a compelling fantasy world and a dedicated cast, but also highlighted the difficulties in translating intricate narratives and complex lore to the cinematic medium within the constraints of a single film. While its box office performance may have been a disappointment, its impact on the **Mortal Instruments** fandom and its role as a precursor to a more successful television series cannot be overlooked. The city of bones may have remained largely unexplored on the big screen, but the spirit of the Shadowhunters continues to thrive in the hearts of its enduring fans.
