4. For minors, proof of driver education completion or supervised driving log.
5. Payment for any applicable fees.

It's always best to check the official Louisiana OMV website for the most up-to-date list of required documents for your specific situation.

The Vehicle You'll Use

You must provide a safe, registered, and insured vehicle for the behind-the-wheel test. Ensure it is in good working order:

1. **Brakes:** Must be fully functional.
2. **Tires:** Properly inflated and with adequate tread.
3. **Lights:** Headlights, taillights, brake lights, and turn signals must all work.
4. **Horn:** Must be functional.
5. **Windshield Wipers:** Essential, especially in Louisiana's frequent rain.
6. **Mirrors:** All mirrors (rearview and side) must be present and properly adjusted.
7. **Cleanliness:** A clean interior and exterior can

create a good impression.

The examiner will likely perform a brief pre-drive check of the vehicle.

During the Road Test

Once you're in the car, the examiner will give you instructions. Listen carefully and ask for clarification if needed. Here are key behaviors the examiner will observe:

1. **Exaggerated Head Turns:** When checking mirrors and blind spots, make your head movements noticeable. This clearly signals to the examiner that you are aware of your surroundings.
2. **Smooth Control:** Avoid jerky movements. Accelerate and brake gently, steer smoothly, and maintain proper speed.
3. **Observation and Scanning:** Constantly scan the road, look at your mirrors frequently, and be aware of traffic.
4. **Signaling:** Always signal your intentions well in advance of turns or lane changes.
5. **Obeying Signs and Signals:** Come to a complete stop at stop signs, and obey all traffic lights and posted speed limits.
6. **Lane Discipline:** Stay within your lane and

perform lane changes safely and correctly.

7. **Following Distance:** Maintain a safe following distance from the vehicle in front of you.
8. **Parking Proficiency:** Execute the required parking maneuver with precision and control.
9. **Communication:** If there's a specific concern or you're unsure about an instruction, it's better to ask than to make a mistake.

Remain calm, focus on the task at hand, and drive as you have been taught and practiced.

Common Mistakes and How to Avoid Them

Many applicants fail the Louisiana driving test not because they lack the basic ability to drive, but due to common, preventable errors. Be aware of these:

1. **Failing to Stop Completely:** Rolling through stop signs or stopping before the line but not fully.
2. **Improper Lane Changes:** Not signaling, not checking blind spots, or cutting off other drivers.
3. **Speeding or Driving Too Slowly:** Adhering to posted speed limits is crucial.
4. **Poor Parking:** Inaccurate parallel parking, hitting cones, or parking too far from the curb.

5. **Not Checking Blind Spots:** A major safety concern and a frequent reason for failure.
6. **Ignoring Traffic Signals:** Running red lights or failing to yield.
7. **Distracted Driving:** Even glancing at your phone can result in immediate failure.
8. **Nervousness Leading to Errors:** Allow practice to build confidence and reduce anxiety.

After the Test: Next Steps

Once you have successfully completed both the written and behind-the-wheel portions of the Louisiana driving test, you will be issued your Louisiana driver's license. For minors, this will be a provisional license with certain restrictions. For adults, it will be a standard driver's license.
