This method requires one extra panel for the overlap. For an 18x18 inch cushion using 1/2 inch seam allowances, we calculated two 19x19 inch panels. For an envelope closure, one of these

panels will be shorter to create the overlap.

1. **Prepare the Back Panel:** Take one of your 19x19 inch panels. This will be the front. For the back panel, you'll cut two pieces.
2. **Calculate Back Panel Dimensions:**
 1. **Width:** Same as the front panel: 19 inches (48cm).
 2. **Height:** Cushion Height + (Seam Allowance x 2) + Overlap = 18 inches + (0.5 inches x 2) + 4 inches (for a generous overlap) = 23 inches (45cm + 1.5cm x 2 + 10cm = 58cm). You will cut ONE panel of 19x23 inches.

This means you will cut ONE panel of 19x19 inches (front) and ONE panel of 19x23 inches (back).
3. **Hem the Back Panel Edges:** Take the 19x23 inch back panel.
 1. On one of the 19-inch sides (this will be the opening edge), fold over 1/2 inch (1.5cm) to the wrong side and press.
 2. Fold over another 1/2 inch (1.5cm) and press again. This creates a double-folded hem.
 3. Stitch along the folded edge to secure the hem.
4. **Overlap Calculation:** The 23-inch panel is now hemmed on one edge. This panel needs to cover the opening from the front panel. The panel length is 23 inches. Let's say your cushion is 18 inches. You need to cover 18 inches. With a 4-inch overlap, $18 + 4 = 22$ inches. The hemmed edge will overlap the raw edge of the other back piece.
5. **Arrange for Sewing:** Lay the front panel (19x19) right side up. Place the back panel (19x23) right side down, aligning the raw edges of the sides and bottom. The hemmed edge of the back panel should extend beyond the top edge of the front panel by at least 4 inches, creating the overlap.

Note on Envelope Calculations: A common calculation for envelope covers is: Front Panel = Cushion Size + Seam Allowance x 2. Back Panel = Front Panel Width x (Cushion Height + Seam Allowance x 2 + Overlap). For a 18x18 cushion with 0.5" seam allowance and a 4" overlap, Front: 19x19. Back: $19 \times (18 + 1 + 4) = 19 \times 23$. Then you hem the opening edge of the back panel.

Sewing Your Cushion Cover: Step-by-Step

With your fabric cut and your closure method decided, it's time to sew! We'll detail the process for the envelope closure, but the principles apply to other methods, with adjustments for the specific closure technique.

Assembling the Envelope Cover

1. **Pin the Layers:** Lay your front panel right side up. Place the back panel right side down on top of the front panel. Align all the raw edges carefully. The hemmed edge of the back panel will be at the top, and the other raw edge will overlap the hemmed edge.
2. **Pin Securely:** Pin around all four sides to hold the layers together. You can add extra pins along the overlap area to keep it from shifting.
3. **Sew the Seams:** Using your sewing machine, stitch around all four sides with your chosen seam

allowance (e.g., 1/2 inch or 1.5cm). Backstitch at the beginning and end of each seam to secure the stitches.

4. **Trim and Clip Corners:** Carefully trim the seam allowance to about 1/4 inch (0.7cm), taking care not to cut through your stitching. Clip the fabric diagonally at each of the four corners. This helps to reduce bulk and create sharper corners when turned right side out.
5. **Turn and Press:** Turn the cushion cover right side out through the envelope opening. Use a point turner or a blunt object (like a chopstick) to gently push out the corners so they are sharp.
6. **Press for a Crisp Finish:** This is a crucial step for a professional look. Carefully press all the seams flat with your iron. Ensure the envelope overlap lays smoothly.

Sewing in a Zipper (Intermediate Level)

If you opt for a zipper, the process is slightly different:

1. **Prepare Panels:** Cut two panels to the required size, including seam allowances on all sides.
2. **Prepare Zipper Edge:** On one of the 19-inch sides of each panel, you'll create a hem to conceal the zipper. Fold over 1/2 inch (1.5cm) twice and press. Stitch this hem.
3. **Attach Zipper:** Lay the two panels right sides together, aligning the un-hemmed sides. Pin the un-hemmed edges together. Using your sewing machine and a zipper foot, stitch a seam down one of the un-hemmed sides, stopping about 1 inch from the end.
4. **Insert Zipper:** Open the fabric. Place the zipper face down along the seam you just created, ensuring the zipper teeth are aligned with the seam line. Baste or pin the zipper in place. Using a zipper foot, sew along the zipper tape, catching the fabric.
5. **Complete Seams:** Close the remaining un-hemmed side seam, continuing from where you stopped for the zipper.
6. **Finish and Press:** Turn the cover right side out, zip it up, and press all seams.

Finishing Touches and Embellishments

Once your cushion cover is sewn and pressed, you can elevate it further with decorative touches.

Adding Personal Flair

1. **Piping:** Piping, a fabric-covered cord, adds a professional and classic finish to the edges of your cushion. You can buy pre-made piping or make your own.
2. **Appliqué:** Cut out shapes from contrasting fabrics and stitch them onto the front of your cushion cover for a unique design.
3. **Embroidery:** Add hand-stitched embroidery for a truly personal touch.
4. **Tassels or Pom-Poms:** These can be added to the corners for a playful or bohemian look.
5. **Fabric Paint or Stencils:** For a quick and easy decorative update, use fabric paint or stencils to add patterns or designs.

Washing and Maintenance Tips
