2. Visualize or Draw a Picture

This is where the mathematical representation of the word problem comes in. For example, for "Sarah had 5 apples and her friend gave her 3 more. How many apples does Sarah have now?", the number sentence would be $5 + 3 = ?$

7. Solve the Problem and Write the Answer

Perform the calculation. Ensure the answer is presented clearly and includes the correct units (e.g., "8 apples," not just "8").

8. Check Your Work

Encourage a quick review. Does the answer make sense in the context of the story? If the problem involves adding, is the answer larger than the starting numbers? If it involves subtraction, is it smaller? This helps catch errors.
