This can lead to accusations of [global governance](#) being skewed.

Funding and Dependence

Many IOs rely on contributions from member states, making them susceptible to funding cuts or political pressure from major donors. This dependence can sometimes compromise their independence and ability to pursue their mandates effectively. Budgetary constraints often impact their operational capacity.

The Rise of New Global Actors

The traditional state-centric model of IOs is increasingly challenged by the growing influence of non-state actors, including INGOs, MNCs, and powerful philanthropic foundations. Integrating these diverse voices and interests into global governance frameworks is an ongoing challenge.

The Future of International Organizations
