3. **Lightly Played (LP):** Shows some minor wear, such as light scratching, minor corner wear, or slight edge whitening.
4. **Moderately Played (MP):** Visible wear, including noticeable edge whitening, scuffing, or minor creases.
5. **Heavily Played (HP):** Significant wear, such as creases, bends, or heavy edge wear.
6. **Damaged (D):** Cards with severe damage like tears, major creases, or water damage.

For high-value cards, professional grading services like PSA (Professional Sports Authenticator) and Beckett Grading Services (BGS) can add significant value. A PSA 10 Gem Mint card will command a premium far exceeding a raw card of the same rarity. The *best Yu-Gi-Oh! grading services* are those with a strong reputation and a consistent track record.

The Impact of Playability and Demand

Beyond rarity and condition, a card's usability in competitive play significantly influences its price. Cards that are staples in top-tier decks, essential for powerful combos, or used in dominant strategies are in high demand among players. These are often referred to as "meta-defining" cards.
