Its psychoactive properties, inducing altered states of consciousness, visions, and a sense of interconnectedness, have led many to believe it was used in ancient shamanic rituals and mystery cults. For believers who adhere to traditional interpretations of Christian scripture and doctrine, the idea that Jesus or early Christianity was connected to psychoactive mushrooms is an unacceptable distortion of their sacred beliefs. They view the cross as a symbol of Christ's unique divinity and sacrifice, untainted by pagan rituals or drug use. The "mushroom and the cross" is often seen as an attempt to deconstruct or co-opt Christian symbolism for alternative spiritual agendas.

The rejection of these theories is rooted in a commitment to established theological frameworks and historical scholarship. While some may find the esoteric interpretations intriguing, they are not representative of mainstream Christian thought or practice. It is important to respect these boundaries and understand that not all symbolic interpretations are universally accepted or welcomed.
