comunicación. Un mismo gesto, como un pulgar hacia arriba, puede tener significados radicalmente diferentes dependiendo de la situación. En muchas culturas occidentales, denota aprobación, pero en otras puede ser ofensivo. La hora del día, la relación entre los interlocutores, el lugar y el propósito de la comunicación son todos elementos del contexto situacional que impactan en la interpretación del significado.

Contexto Cultural e Histórico: Las Raíces del Sentido

El **contexto cultural e histórico** también juega un papel fundamental. Las palabras y expresiones adquieren significados específicos dentro de una cultura y a lo largo del tiempo. Es un proceso dinámico de **recepción e interpretación por parte del receptor**. El receptor, con su propio bagaje de conocimientos, experiencias, creencias y valores, reconstruye el significado propuesto por el emisor.

El Papel de los Conocimientos Previos y la Experiencia

Los **conocimientos previos** del receptor, también conocidos como esquemas cognitivos, influyen enormemente en cómo se interpreta la información. Una persona con un profundo conocimiento de física interpretará una descripción de un fenómeno físico de manera diferente a alguien sin ese conocimiento. De manera similar, las **experiencias personales** tiñen nuestra comprensión. Una palabra que para alguien evoca recuerdos felices, para otro puede ser un detonante de emociones negativas.

La Teoría de la Relevancia y la Búsqueda de Eficiencia Cognitiva

La **teoría de la relevancia**, desarrollada por Sperber y Wilson, sugiere que los interlocutores buscan la máxima relevancia en la comunicación, es decir, el máximo efecto cognitivo con el mínimo esfuerzo. Esto implica que el receptor no solo decodifica el mensaje, sino que también inferirá las intenciones del emisor y utilizará el contexto para optimizar su comprensión. Esta inferencia activa es un componente clave en la co-creación del significado. ### Conclusión: Un Tapiz Interconectado de Elementos En resumen, los **componentes del significado** conforman un tapiz complejo e interconectado. Desde la relación fundamental entre significante y significado, pasando por los niveles de denotación y connotación, hasta la influencia omnipresente del contexto, la intención del emisor y la activa interpretación del receptor, cada elemento contribuye a la riqueza y profundidad de nuestro entendimiento. Analizar estos componentes nos permite no solo apreciar la sutileza de la

comunicación humana, sino también comprender mejor los desafíos y las oportunidades que surgen en el proceso comunicativo. Ya sea en la vida cotidiana, en la literatura, en el marketing o en la diplomacia, la comprensión profunda de los componentes del significado es una herramienta indispensable para una comunicación efectiva y significativa. La semántica y la pragmática, en constante diálogo, continúan ofreciendo nuevas perspectivas sobre este fascinante fenómeno.
