It's easy to get so focused on your own knowledge that you neglect the provided image or text. Always re-center your focus on the stimulus. The

question is designed to be answered *in relation to* that specific piece of information.

Time Management Issues

The MCQ section is timed. If you spend too long on one difficult question, you might not have enough time for others. Develop a strategy for moving on if you're stuck. You can always return to challenging questions if time permits.
